

Fourth Delta Plan draft to be released Monday by DSC

The fourth staff draft of the Delta Plan is set to be released Monday, June 13. It will be available on the Delta Stewardship Council <u>website</u>. The council will discuss the new draft during a <u>meeting</u> on Thursday, June 16, in West Sacramento. The Delta Plan will guide state and local agencies to help achieve a more reliable water supply for California while protecting and enhancing the Delta.

Commission updates study for national heritage area in Delta

The Delta Protection Commission has released an update on the feasibility study to establish a national heritage area (NHA) in the Delta. The NHA would help increase appreciation and understanding of the Delta while increasing opportunities for economic development and public access. A timeline and other details on the NHA are available on the commission's <u>website</u>. Public comments are being accepted through Friday, July 15.

Public invited to hear update on development of BDCP The California Natural Resources Agency will hold a public meeting to update the public on development of the <u>Bay Delta Conservation Plan</u> (BDCP). The meeting will be held Wednesday, June 15, in West Sacramento. It will include discussion on the purpose and process for working groups. EPA begins survey of wetlands across California, nation

The U.S. Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) is collaborating with state, tribal and federal agencies for the first survey on the status of the nation's wetlands. The National Wetlands Condition Assessment will look at more than 1,000 sites across the country, including 43 in California. This is part of a series of forums hosted by DWR to gather and share information on the California Water Plan and other water issues.

Draft action plan looks at climate change and water quality The <u>Council on Environmental Quality</u> has released a <u>draft action plan</u> to help federal agencies ensure water quality and availability in light of a changing climate. The plan includes ways for agencies to support state, local and tribal governments in their water resources planning. Details are available in a <u>news release</u> from the White House.
